Water

This term we are going to be investigating water and linking the whole of our curriculum around this, including maths.

Over half term the children were asked to think about how to conserve water. They will be sharing their findings with the rest of the school as we try to reduce our water footprint. In addition, we asked them to keep a water diary and we will be using this data in maths.



We will be looking at the importance of water to the human race and learning about the water cycle in science, linking this back to the research the children completed over half term.

In literacy we are working hard at improving our key skills especially using higher level punctuation such as brackets, colons, semi colons, dashes and speech marks.

- works. Then set challenges such as 'how much will water cost for ten years?'
- Spend some time at the library researching different rivers

Mathletics Mad!

There have been lots of changes in Maths during term 1 here at Hoo! Every week the children are having a maths gap test which tests the breadth of their mathematical knowledge. The scores are added into our weekly house point totals.

We are using this information to inform our planning for the next week to ensure that all children make as much progress as



possible.

Alongside this, the children can now receive house points for the number of Mathletics certificates they achieve in a week.

To achieve a bronze certificate they need to score 1000 points on Mathletics during one week. Once they have five bronze certificates they work their way towards a silver certificate. then after four silver certificates they can achieve a gold one!
Certificates will be given out in assembly.

Well done to Abbey-May 5U, Shannon 5T, Kelly 6X and Sally 6Y who read the most on their classes in term 1.



Homework



Your child will continue to receive three pieces of homework a week

- Maths
- Curriculum
- Spellings

Their maths homework will be based around key skills they need to improve in order to progress and will be something they've been working on that week. It may be set on Mathletics.

Curriculum homework will be continue to be linked to the topic they've been studying in class that week, or may be based around one of the Thinkers' Keys. We will continue to use the learning platform to set homework and will discuss further with children how to access and submit work on it.

If you don't have access to a computer at home, we can organise for children to access one of the computers in school.

Your child will receive between

10 and 20 words to learn for spellings each week. These will then be tested the following Wednesday.

If homework isn't completed on time, your child will be expected to stay in and do it during their lunch hour. If they're struggling with it, they need to let us know by Monday so that we can plan in time to support them— Wednesday morning is too late.
