

# Hoo St Werburgh Primary School & Marlborough Centre

## PE and Sports Funding Report 2013-2014

**The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of Physical Education and Sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. As we are accountable for this money, the spending and impact of this funding is also monitored by Ofsted.**

### **The amount of grant received**

The school has received £9605 from Medway as additional Sports Funding during the academic year 2013-2014. This has been fully allocated to enable a range of improvements.

### **This money has been used to**

- extend existing Specialist Sports Coach provision
- provide additional specialist coaching
- provide additional Sports resources
- extend club provision
- extend the quantity and variety of inter schools competitive sports provision
- extend the PE and Sport training offer to staff to improve skills
- purchase a support package from the Howard School's Sports Partnership, further supporting leadership development and additional coaching
- enable our Sports Coach to lead lunchtime games in KS2, two days per week

### **The impact**

The school has managed to maintain its 2 hour sports provision.

As a result of this additional provision pupils have had access to an increased range of competitive sports and a wide range of clubs for enjoyment. Children have benefitted from an externally led Dance club and Gymnastics club and our Shikon Martial Arts club continues to be well attended. Leadership of Sport is developing and funding is allocated for future Leadership training with the IOE (Institute of Education, London) as a result of our New Horizons Teaching Alliance partnership work.

The school reviews its sports enrichment programme annually.
