Design your own Viking God. Add an explanation of their powers and legacy.

Write a recipe for a raid:

You will need:
20 angry Vikings
1 longboat
1 monastery
Several peaceful Anglo--Saxon monks...

With a family member or a friend, argue the importance of learning about the past.

Consider:

- Why do we study history?
- What would happen if We did not learn about the past?

Make your own life-sized 1066 soldier. Ask someone to draw around your body outline. Create the armour using collage materials.

Find out about the types of shields used in the Battle of Hastings, design and/or create your own shield.

Write a job application to be a soldier. Use the features of persuasive writing to ensure you are successful!

Write a newspaper report about the events at the Battle of Hastings. You could write it from the point of view of the Normans or the Saxons.

Visit a castle or fort with your family. Take lots of pictures and tell your class about it upon your return.

Using the Bayeux Tapestry as inspiration, design a new tapestry to show a story of your choosing.

Create an advert for a Saxon/Viking weapon – can you think of a slogan and a price?

Design or make a fort or castle, label any strengths and defence mechanisms it has.

Write a rap or song about 1066 or the Saxons/Viking – then perform it to your family.
