
Merit Winners

Notes and information for next term

We have been learning to use base ten to understand tens and ones.

Raindrops and Rainbows

Our next topic is Raindrops and Rainbows, which is a geography based topic. Children will be identifying seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot and cold areas of the world. In this topic the children will be given the opportunity of exploring the key components of the weather, and the impact that it has on them, other people and their surroundings. This will include reviewing more dramatic weather events that have happened during the lifetime of members of their immediate family.
