## **Term 2 Reflection**

Our Learning Journey this term was based around the question 'Could I be a Nutritionist?' and there have been plenty of exciting opportunities to aid the children's learning about food and nutrition.

To start the term, we had a food tasting afternoon with the children being very brave and blind tasting a range of food and predicting if they thought it was healthy or unhealthy. We then had a visit from Caterlink (school



dinner providers) who aided our science knowledge by teaching us all about the eatwell plate and why a balanced diet is important and how they make sure our school dinners offer plenty of healthy options.



In geography, we moved onto thinking about where and how our food is produced and investigated fair trade products by visiting the local co-op store and finding products with the fair trade logo on. The children represented themselves and the school impeccably during our visit to the co-op with lots of local residents commenting on their good behaviour and manners, which they should be very proud of. We then moved onto more locally produced food with a visit from the National Fruit Show education team (sponsored by local fruit producers - Gotham's). During this

exciting workshop we found out all about the different varieties of apples, got to taste lots of new flavours and textures of apple and even made our own apple juice which was very yummy!

We finished the term off with our parents tea party with the children having the opportunity to make a range of healthy (and a few unhealthy) snacks for you all and having the opportunity to show off all their fabulous work from this term. Reading fluency continues to grow across the year group as the children's confidence in reading grows. 
# Maths
