

Last term in Year 3:

Last term, Year 4 immersed themselves in the fascinating world of Ancient Greece. They began by locating Greece on a map and discovering how its unique landscape led to the rise of independent city-states, each with its own identity and way of life. The children explored the origins of democracy, learning how the Ancient Athenians helped shape many of the ideas we still use today.



Their curiosity grew as they delved into Greek philosophy, discussing big questions inspired by thinkers like Socrates and Aristotle. They also enjoyed exploring the rich world of gods, myths, and legendary heroes, uncovering the stories that have influenced literature for thousands of years.

A highlight of the term was the WOW Greek Day, where pupils dressed up, took part in themed activities, and brought their learning to life. In D&T, they designed and created their own Greek-style helmets, combining creativity with historical understanding. Even in science, the theme continued, as they linked their learning on states of matter to how materials were used and changed in the ancient world.
